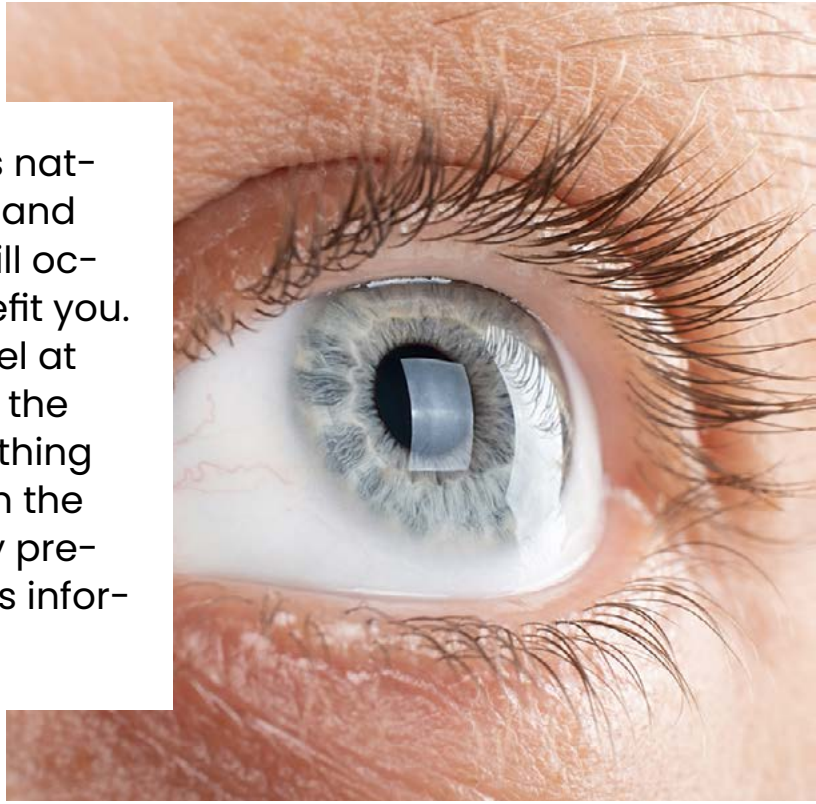

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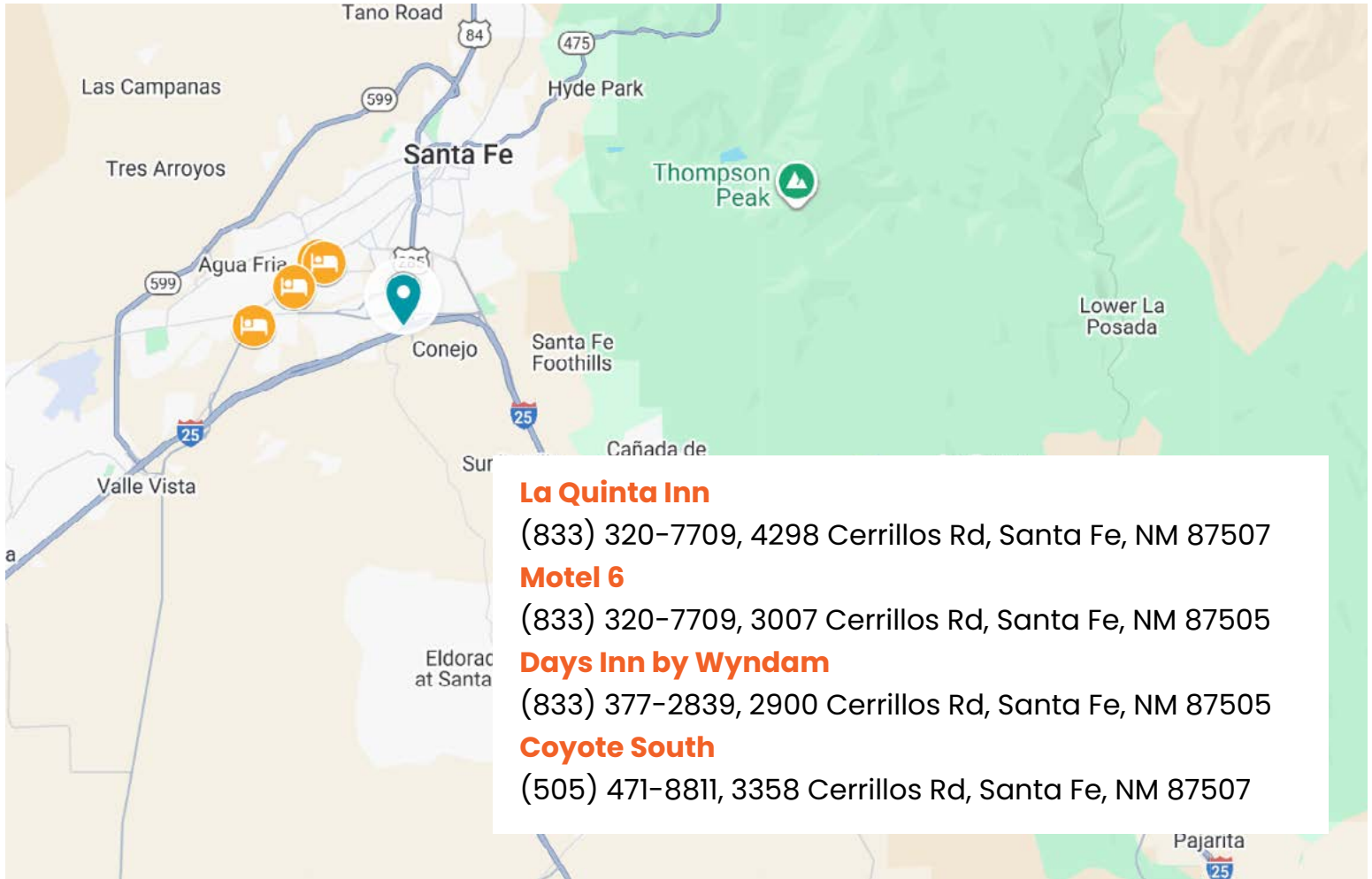

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Scheduling Your Surgery

Scheduling Your Procedure

Your doctor will provide you with the date and arrival time of your surgery. The doctor's office provides surgery center staff with your surgical case information. Please make sure that your doctor has your current contact information in case the surgery center needs to contact you before surgery.



Pre-Operative Assessment

HEA Surgery Center uses SIS Charts to access forms you will need to complete before surgery. This allows the Surgery Center to obtain your medical and surgical history so anesthesia can be administered safely. SIS Charts will send you a link to complete the forms at your convenience. You **MUST** complete these forms prior to surgery to avoid delay or rescheduling. A preoperative call nurse will call you the day before surgery to review the forms with you. If you experience issues, contact the nurse at 505-474-9880.

Items Needed for SIS Exchange

- List of all medications (with dosage and frequency).
- List of surgeries within the past 10 years requiring anesthesia.
- Name and phone number of the responsible adult (18+) who will drive you home after surgery.



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Financial Matters



Charges & Payments

Surgery Center of Santa Fe fees are separate from your surgeon's professional and anesthesia fees.

If a specimen is taken, you will receive a separate laboratory/pathology bill.

Surgery Center of Santa Fe accepts most major commercial insurance (HMO/PPO), Medicare, and Texas Medicaid.

The Surgery Center will bill your insurance company, and any balance due is the patient's responsibility.

Medicaid patients must have valid Medicaid identification at the time of surgery.

Payment Information

- Patients with insurance must pay co-payments, co-insurance, or deductibles on or before the day of surgery.
- Uninsured/cash-pay patients must pay in full on or before the day of surgery.
- Accepted payment forms: Visa, Mastercard, Discover, AMEX, Care Credit, personal check, or cash.
- The billing office will contact you beforehand with an estimated amount due.

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Preparing for Surgery

When to Notify Your Doctor

Contact your doctor's office immediately if:

- You or a household member experience illness (cough, fever, cold, etc.).
- You suspect you are pregnant.

Food and Drink Guidelines

Food and drink before anesthesia can cause choking, vomiting, or aspiration and pose safety risks. Follow these rules or your case may be delayed or canceled. Contact your doctor's office if you have questions.

INSTRUCTIONS FROM DEPT. OF ANESTHESIA

Adult Surgical Patients – Surgery BEFORE 12 noon &/OR General Anesthesia:

- **Take morning medications with sips of water (unless it upsets your stomach).**
- **No food or drink after midnight before surgery.**
- **Diabetics: Do not take medications the morning of surgery.**
 - **If using an insulin pump, set to basal rate.**
 - **If blood sugar <80, drink a small glass of clear fruit juice (not orange juice).**

INSTRUCTIONS FROM DEPT. OF ANESTHESIA

Adult Surgical Patients – Surgery AFTER 12 noon:

- **Take morning medications with sips of water.**
- **You may have water, apple or cranberry juice, soda, or black coffee (no milk or cream) up to 2 hours before arrival time.**
- **You may NOT have: solid food, candy, gum, milk, dairy, or orange juice.**
- **Diabetic instructions as above.**



Day of Surgery

Checklist

- Follow food and drink requirements.
- An adult (18+) driver must bring you home and remain within one mile or on-site.
- Brush teeth and shower (no lotion or perfume).
- No contact lenses.
- Leave valuables at home.
- Wear loose, comfortable clothing (button tops preferred, no dresses).
- Bring medication list, insurance card, photo ID, and payment method.
- Bring Medical Power of Attorney/Guardianship papers if applicable.

Arrival

Arrival time is given by your doctor's office.

If delayed, call xxx-xxx-xxx. **Arrival time \neq surgery time — plan up to four hours from check-in to discharge.**

Process Overview

- **Registration:** Check in, complete paperwork, and pay any balance.
- **Pre-Op:** Nurse prepares you; anesthesiologist evaluates and administers medication.
- **Surgery:** Surgeon performs the operation with the surgical team.
- **Recovery:** Nurse monitors you until discharge. Discharge instructions provided verbally and on paper. A nurse will call the following day to check on your recovery.

Post-Surgery

If you received anesthesia, you must:

- Leave with a responsible adult.
- Not drive for 24 hours.
- Have an adult present for 24 hours post-surgery.



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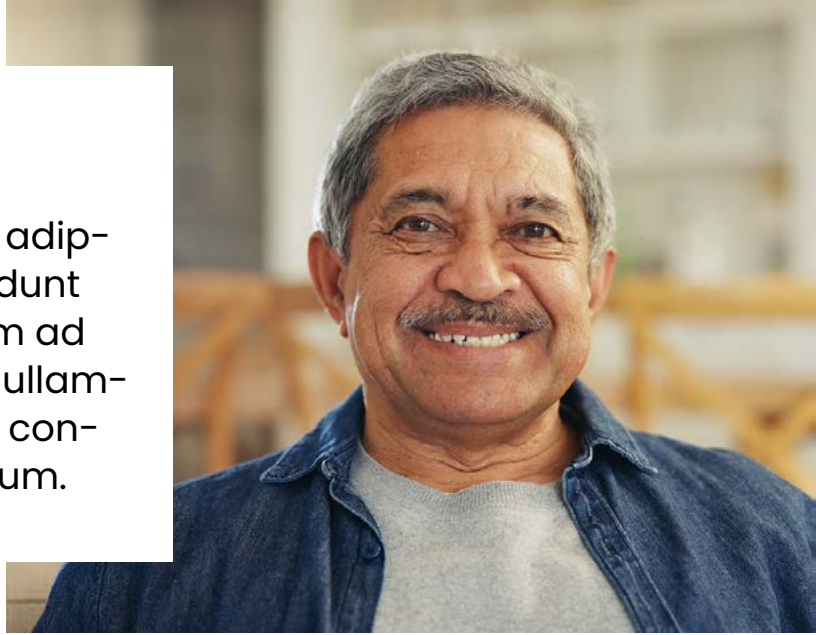
